

English Schools Table Tennis Association Under 11's Team Events – report by Janet Field

Excellent Performance from Amherst's Girls



The School's Under 11's Girls' team consisting of Lois M,
Connie C, Alice M and Olivia W competed at the English
Schools TTA Southern Region finals held on 8th February at
the Bristol Academy of Sport. This covers the whole of
southern England from Kent to Cornwall and Worcester to
Wiltshire.

They were in a group of 4 with the winners of Groups 6 and 8 Fox Primary (Kensington & Chelsea) and Enmore CE Academy, Devon respectively and the Runners Up of Zone 5 Blackminster Middle School, Worcestershire.

The girls were fortunate not to have to play the strong favourites, Fox first, and played Enmore whom they beat 5-3 in a very close and keenly contested match after a nervous start. They tackled Blackminster with more confidence and won comfortably 8-0. Playing Fox in their third match was effectively the final. Fox have been together as a team for three years with twice weekly coaching from an international player and it showed. Three of the Amherst girls only began playing in October but they listened to their own coaches and improved as they went along. It was an outstanding performance even to reach the Southern Region finals after such a short time together as a team, let alone win two matches out of three. This places the girls in the top eight nationally, which is an amazing achievement.
