

returning to school from Monday 8th March! As communicated earlier in the week, I will send out next week the full return to school letter but I wanted to give you a few important headlines today:

We will be following the same systems, procedures and protective measures as the autumn term. Please don't worry if you have forgotten some of the timings and systems as December really does seem a long time ago! My letter next week will provide all the necessary information as was sent out in September.

A vital new protective measure introduced in January was the twice weekly lateral flow testing of staff. This will continue until the government informs us otherwise. For me, this was a significant change and provides us with much reassurance that asymptomatic cases in our school community would be caught early.

It has also been reassuring that since January, we have only had one positive case (with no close contacts identified) in our school community. This period was during the height of the second wave and is therefore immensely encouraging.

It may be useful to check your child's school uniform and PE kit this weekend to ensure you can find it and that it all still fits. This will allow you a week to order items if needed.

Some other points to note are:

- Instrumental music lessons will commence week beginning 15th March
- **Sports coaches** (Handball, hockey, football and rugby) will be able to attend from 8th March to enable us to continue to provide a high quality PE curriculum
- Breakfast Club and After School Club will be open from 8th March
- Full menu to be offered by the school kitchen from 8th March



I am aware that for some children the **return to school** may make them feel **anxious** and **nervous**. Some will have got used to working independently at their own pace in a **quiet space** at home and will need to transition back to the classroom environment.



Some children will be **anxious about the social dynamics** that school brings. Many children have missed being together with their friends where as for some

the return to the intricacies and challenges of childhood relationships will worry them.

All children will have had a different experience working remotely at home depending on their personal circumstances. Staff are acutely aware of this and will provide children with opportunities to discuss and share their experiences as part of their transition back to school.

Some Key Worker children who have been in school throughout this period of closure may find it hard to adjust to the full school being back. The playground will be busier and classrooms will be fuller.



We will ...

do all we can to support the children during this transitional phase. The vast majority of children will take the return in their stride and I'm sure by

the end of the first couple of days it will feel very normal again.

We will ...

also do all we can to support children if there are gaps in their learning due to this period of school closure. We will be completing assessments before the Easter holidays which alongside day to day classroom performance will help identify any gaps in their English and maths subject knowledge.

Parent Consultations

We will be holding Zoom parent consultations the weeks beginning 26th April and 4th May to provide you with an update on your child's academic, social and emotional progress.

Friday 5th March—NO Registration and Lessons

To enable teachers to fully prepare for the children's return we have decided that on Friday 5th March there will be no Zoom registrations & live lessons or comments /questions answered on Google Classroom. This will provide the teachers with the time to prepare their classrooms ready for Monday 8th March.

World Book Day 4th March postponed

Due to World Book day falling during a period of school closure we have postponed the event to Thursday 10th June. The children love coming to school in their costumes and it would be such a shame for this to be lost. The weather will also be a little warmer which helps with certain costumes! We will give out the £1 book vouchers when the children return to school.
