PPA and Early Career Teacher mentor cover will be provided across the school by Mrs Wisdom (two days), Mrs Huntley (2 days), Mrs Fox (one day), Mrs Lester (two days) and Mrs Rawlins (one day). Mrs Carver will provide PPA and Assistant Headteacher release time for 5J one day a week.

When I look at our teaching team for September, I am immensely proud that our three new Year Group Leaders (Miss Wonnacott, Mr Barratt and Mrs Archer) started their teaching careers at Amherst. It has been wonderful to see them develop as teachers and now progress to a leadership role within the school. One of my main strategies to running a successful school continues to be to recruit and retain outstanding teachers. Our middle leadership structure is an excellent retention tool and provides those teachers with leadership experience and opportunities. If they decide to progress further in school leadership their experience gained at Amherst puts them in a strong position to do so.

I would like to take this opportunity to praise the Year 6 children and staff for putting together such an incredible production of Aladdin. The show was filmed on Tuesday evening and we can't wait to share with Year 6 parents the end product. I am always amazed at the depth of talent and confidence that the children demonstrate. Despite not having an audience, they still created a wonderful atmosphere. It was great to see so many children enjoying performing and working together as a team.

Thank you to our incredible PTA team that have now raised just over £150,000 to enable our Grand Designs building project to become a reality. We have recently had planning permission approved and now move to the next phase of going out to tender. The new building will provide much needed additional teaching space during the day and a permanent home for our Breakfast and After School Clubs. Thank you to all parents that have contributed so generously through the wide range of virtual events that have been held over the last 18 months. Your support for current and future Amherst pupils is greatly appreciated.

At the time of writing this letter there is still much uncertainty about the COVID procedures and protocols that schools may need to follow in September. Schools will most likely find out from the DfE in late August.

My hope is that September is very much back to normal. We will know a little more on Monday 19th July. Regarding Sports Day, we will wait to see what changes are planned for 19th July and then review our options about parents attending. We will communicate more when procedures are confirmed.
