COVID UPDATE

As you will be aware, from 24th February the legal requirement to self-isolate if you have Covid has been removed. The new government guidance document (COVID-19 RESPONSE: LIVING WITH COVID-19) states:


"Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. After 5 days, they may choose to take a Lateral Flow Device (LFD) followed by another the next day - if both are negative, and they do not have a temperature, they can safely return to their normal routine. Those who test positive should avoid contact with anyone in an at risk group, including if they live in the same household."

I will continue to keep you updated if the guidance changes further. The **next key date** will be 1st April where further changes regarding testing are expected.

WARNING OF ESSENTIAL ROADWORKS IN RIVERHEAD

Essential work to replace old metal gas mains with new plastic pipes will be carried out this spring to ensure our community continues to receive a safe and reliable gas supply. WCB Utilities will **start work on 21 March** for approximately 25 weeks.

To safely access the gas network, it will be necessary to close the following roads. Access will be maintained for residents and signed diversions will be in place.

- **Packhorse Road** We will close the road from the junction with Westerham Road to outside Goblins from 21 March for approximately five weeks.
- Homedean/Westerham Road Homedean Road from the junction with Packhorse Road to outside Brookwood; Westerham Road from the junction with Packhorse Road to the junction with A25 from 2 April for approximately two weeks.
- Barnfield Road from the 9 May for approximately three weeks.
- Cold Arbor Road from the junction with Westerham Road to outside property number 11 from 27 May for approximately two weeks.
- Bullfinch Lane from 25 July for approximately six weeks.

WCB engineers will also be working in **Cranmer Road, St Marys Drive, Baden Powell Road and Elmstead Close** asking motorists to 'Give and Take' when passing the site.

COVID-19 VACCINATIONS

The NHS in Kent and Medway is now offering the Covid-19 vaccine to **eligible children** aged five to 11-years-old who are at higher risk from coronavirus due to underlying health conditions or share living accommodation, on most days, with someone who has a weakened immune system. If they have an eligible child, parents will be invited to bring them to have the vaccine by their GP practice, a local vaccination service linked to their GP practice, or the NHS School-Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS).
