It has been great this week to commence swimming lessons and see the enjoyment gained by the children. We train our teachers and TAs to be lifeguards, renewing their training every two years. Teachers have completed their

Level 1 and 2 NCTP training programme which enables them to plan and deliver high quality swimming lessons. **Congratulations** to Miss Harvey and Mr Brown who successfully completed their qualification this week.

Once the children's swimming ability has been assessed we will now commence our non-swimmers club which is held at lunchtime. Our aim is that all children will leave Amherst School being able to swim 25m (approx. 1 1/2 lengths of our pool) unaided. For more confident swimmers, our swimming curriculum ensures that they too progress and

develop their skills and stamina further. Swimming is an enjoyable activity in itself but also a vital life skill. We are so fortunate to have this wonderful resource onsite.
