If not addressed early the educational gap widens...

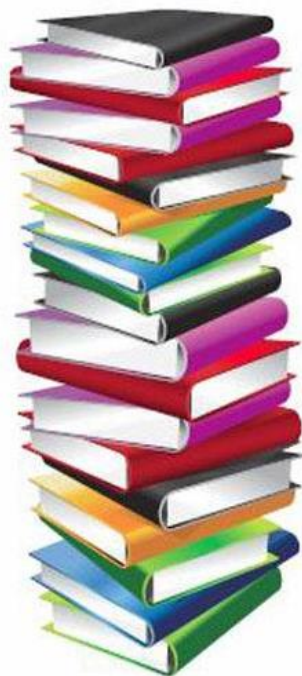
Child A

per school year



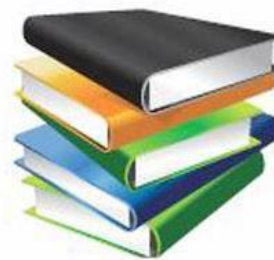
Child B
