MESSAGE FROM MR REID TRUST

This term's school value is trust. At Amherst we have six school values, each one linked to a term. The themes for assemblies are linked to that value and give us the opportunity as a school to explore and discuss further.

We have structured our PSHE curriculum (taught weekly) around our values. So this term all PSHE lessons are based on trust. Values can, and should be explicitly taught. Kindness can be taught rather than accepting that some people are kind and some people unkind.

During this week's assemblies I explored with the children the characteristics that make somebody trustworthy. We identified ten characteristics:

- It takes time to build trust
- Be consistent in your behaviours
- Give feedback respectfully
- Be honest
- Help people
- Show your feelings
- Don't show off or put other people down
- Admit mistakes
- Do what you believe is right
- Don't make promises you can't keep

I read to the children the story of Apollo 13 from *Rescue* by David Long. We discussed how the crew in space had to trust the team at mission control to help them find a solution. The team effort of mathematicians and scientists that day saved the lives of the crew who were about to run out of oxygen. It is an inspiring story of human ingenuity and bravery.

The children enjoyed the workshops on Wednesday. I hope they have come home and talked about it to you. If not, maybe find some time this weekend to discuss what they learnt. The focus was:

Food - Eating the right foods

Rest - Getting enough sleep

Exercise - Being active

Devices - Managing time on devices

HARVEST FESTIVAL

The loaves and fishes food bank at St John's Church Hall has now been running for over 12 years. The charity, which was originally set up as parents at the local school had concerns a few children were arriving at school hungry, now supports families across the whole of Sevenoaks. Donations come from local schools, churches and Sainsbury's and provide much needed essential items. The families receive a bag of food every week of the year.

Free school meals

If your child is under 19 and in full-time education, you may be able to get free school meals for them. The quickest and easiest way to apply for school meals is to apply online.

Who can get them

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
