#### Child of st kilda


I am pleased to be able to inform you that our next whole school text will be 'Child of St Kilda' by Beth Waters. It is a beautiful and fascinating book that I'm sure will inspire children and staff to produce some amazing outcomes.

We complete two book projects each year, one after October half term and one after February half term. The projects are designed to promote and facilitate high quality creative writing and art. Over the years they have become a key part of our curriculum and the children's learning journey at Amherst. To view past projects completed please see the gallery on our <u>school website</u>.

If you were not aware **St Kilda is a group of remote islands** off the west coast of Scotland. Up until the 1930s they were inhabited by a small population. Sadly life on the island became unsustainable and the difficult decision was made to evacuate the population and move to the mainland. **'Child of St Kilda' describes life on the island prior to the evacuation and what happened afterwards.** 

The islands are now a **dual world heritage** site maintained by National Trust Scotland. There is a wealth of information about the islands on the <u>National Trust</u> <u>Website</u>. You can even visit the island using <u>Google Maps Street View</u>!

I would encourage you to buy a copy of 'Child of St Kilda' over half term so your child can read it before studying it in school. It is currently £10.49 on Amazon for a hard back copy. It was a wonderful book which will be enjoyed by children and adults. For further information about Beth Waters the author and her research trips to St Kilda I would recommend visiting her <u>website</u>.
