Ring for the King

Throughout the country plans are being made to Ring for the King at the Coronation of King Charles III on 6 May 2023.

For hundreds of years church bells have rung out, not only to call communities to worship, but also to celebrate special occasions, in remembrance of others and to signify special events. They are part of the soundscape of the UK. In June 2022 we all celebrated Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee with the sound of bells. Bells also rang out with a muffled sound throughout the nation as a mark of respect at her passing in September 2022.

Following the announcement of King Charles' Coronation, the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers initiated an appeal to recruit more ringers to be trained in time to Ring for the King.

For anyone learning a string or wind instrument, we have Winds Together and Strings Together groups starting next term that are open to anyone who isn't a complete beginner on their instrument.

Parts will be arranged to fit the level of each player. These groups are being run by one of our peripatetic wind teachers, Philippa Henderson and a Bromley based string teacher Tim Wells, who has a wealth of group music making expertise and is currently Head of Strings at Bromley Youth Music Trust.

Please encourage your child to sign up on the online clubs form if they play a string or wind instrument so that they can enjoy the benefits of group music making.

How you can ring in our new King

If you've ever wanted to try the ancient art of bell ringing, the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles is the ideal opportunity. The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers

is calling for people to come forward and be trained in time to Ring for the King on 6 May. Part of British life for centuries, ringing Part of Brussn line for centures, ringing church bells requires a blend of physical exercise and mental agility, according to experts. The skill can be learnt by adults and older children – in most bell towers, you can sign up from the age of 11.
