

MESSAGE FROM MR REID

Fairness

I hope all of you had a good Easter break and found some moments to relax. The children have returned to school full of enthusiasm and keen to commence the summer term.

This term's value is Fairness and has been the focus of both my assemblies this week. We have had some really interesting discussions about what makes somebody a fair person. What is it that a fair person says or does for others to describe them as fair? I shared with the children the following list of character traits that fair people display.

We also discussed what is a good life? A philosophical question I gave to the children was *Is it better to be rich or happy*? This question sparked much debate and many interesting contributions followed. The majority felt being happy was more important than being rich. Joe S in Year 6 gave an excellent response in which he described that doing a job that made you happy would make you successful, that then may lead you to earning enough money, which is needed to be happy. I thought this was such a mature and insightful comment.

Road Safety Awareness

With the lighter mornings and evenings upon us, and more children walking to and from school, we wish to have a whole school focus on road safety. The School Council are helping to educate the children in their own classes about the importance of road safety through assembly and class discussions, using slides they have designed themselves. Classes will take part in practical sessions outside school, led by their class teachers, to help children have greater awareness of the importance of personal responsibility for their own safety. Please take some time over the forthcoming weeks to talk to your children about road safety and the Green Cross Code.

Your children's safety is of paramount importance.

Parents and local residents regularly raise concerns about

the parking situation outside the school gates. We recognise that drop off and pick up are always busy times for everyone but we urge parents who drive to school to **consider** where they are parking, making sure they are not exacerbating the situation by making it more dangerous for the children.
