## MESSAGE FROM MR REID

### New Year 3

Welcome to our weekly newsletter, new year 3 parents! It was wonderful to have you visit us in school this week and show you around Amherst.

It was Kent schools transition day yesterday so the current year 2 children (who will join us in September) visited in the morning — they spent time with their new teachers and buddies, with lots of excitement all round! Also, many of our current year 6s went to their new schools for the day to meet staff and fellow students ahead of their move up to Secondary education.

### School Meals

I would like to promote and share how fantastic and unique our school lunches are. Not many schools run their own kitchen, with the majority using a contract catering company. Our kitchen team are directly employed and managed by Amherst which creates a high sense of loyalty, commitment and belonging.

I have worked in many schools over the years and have never experienced the high quality of food and menu choice that we have at Amherst. All staff are offered a lunch each day which supports our team but also ensures we are eating the same food as the children. The quality and taste is excellent. I know one of the highlights of my day is eating lunch! The atmosphere in the hall is one of enjoyment and relaxation.

One of our key points of difference to most primary schools is that the **children order what they want for lunch each morning.** We really do **cook to order** like a restaurant. **The range of choice on the menu is superb**. <u>Please click here to see our current menu</u>. Children can choose from a hot meal (vegetarian/vegan option available), jacket potato, pasta or bread. Fresh fruit and dessert is available daily. Our aim is for **all children to eat a good lunch** and be **energised for the afternoon**.

One aspect of our menu you might not be aware of is **the daily bread & salad** option (wraps, baguettes, etc with a range of fillings). It is like having a packed lunch but at school. Something to consider if your child is currently having packed lunches.

Our uptake remains high (approx. 80%) but we would welcome more children having school dinners. It is becoming increasingly hard financially due to increased food and staffing costs. From September we are increasing the daily price to £2.55. I am sure you will agree this is still excellent value.
