

Year Five Autumn Term

Dear Parents,

This session will be an opportunity to meet the Year 5 teachers and to find out important information such as routines, expectations and exciting events in the year ahead. <u>Topics</u>

This list is not definitive but it gives you an idea of the areas being addressed this term. In order to aid your child's research, our topics for the autumn term are:

- Literacy:
 - Street Child (Berlie Doherty linking to our current topic, Victorians)
 - Victorian texts

Feel free to purchase a copy of these texts for your child to bring in to school, but please wait to read them until we have introduced them in class.

- **Maths:** Properties of number, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions.
- Science: Earth, Sun and Moon, Properties of Materials.
- History: The Victorians
- **Computing:** Internet Safety, Coding, use of Microsoft PowerPoint
- **RE:** Green religion. What do religious and nonreligious worldviews teach about caring for the Earth?

<u>Homework</u>

Maths and English: Each week, Mental Arithmetic books will be handed out on **Thursdays**, to be returned at the latest by the following **Monday**. We ask for two tests to be completed (unless otherwise stated.) It is imperative that the children complete any corrections each week.

In addition, Literacy work will be handed out on **Thursdays**. This Literacy homework should be completed and returned at the latest by the following **Tuesday**. MA and English homework should take 2 hours to complete in total.

Spelling: Your child should practise the 10 spelling words for the Weekly Spelling Test the following Friday. We will expect to see evidence of spelling practice in the back of their English Homework Books (we will show examples of this at the Meet the Teacher event). These 10 words will be drawn from these sources:

- The spelling rule taught in class that week in our spelling lesson.
- The National Curriculum's Year 5/6 'statutory word list'.

In addition, there will be a challenge section to the spelling tests made up of words taken from 11+ spelling lists and topic specific lists.

Reading: Your child should be encouraged to read for at least half an hour daily whether independently or with an adult. The children must record the book title and the pages read in their planners along with at least one detailed comment per week. A parent or guardian must sign the reading each week. **Planners** are due in on **Fridays** and will also be used throughout the week, so must be in school every day.

School Equipment

All children this term will need:

- A good quality fountain pen with plenty of spare blue ink cartridges
- Compass
- Protractor
- Multi-coloured fine liners
- Glue
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Spare whiteboard pens
- A calculator

They should also have a pocket dictionary and thesaurus to support their literacy work. Please ensure your children have everything they need and that all equipment is labelled.

Games and PE

Children should have their PE kit in school every day; please ensure all items are named.

- Amherst or plain navy t-shirt, shorts and white socks
- Trainers (in wet weather, you will need clean trainers or plimsolls for indoor sports)
- Swimming trunks for boys / one piece for girls; swimming hats, goggles and a towel for everyone
- **Optional:** Navy blue school sweatshirt and navy blue jogging trousers for cold weather
- Will advise when needed: Football/rugby boots (soft studs), shin pads and knee-high navy socks
