Priorities for 2022-23

- Continue to use (and try to acquire more) local sports clubs and coaches to support the quality of teaching and learning. Athletics coach has been identified.
- To introduce new system of tracking children's data and assessment through the GetSet4PE website (staff training to follow)
- Track and assess pupils' swimming ability to ensure we have a clear record of who can or can't swim 25m (2 lengths of our pool would be 30m)
- To introduce and maintain the new system of 'Sports Leaders'. Keep training for the children up-to-date. (Order sportswear for the sports leaders)
- To ensure the children continue to have access to 2 hours of physical activity during curriculum time (reinforce and suggest alternative sessions to teachers if wet weather)
- To continue to reinforce the use of the Get Set 4 PE scheme of work and resources and provide all staff with up-to-date training
- To achieve Platinum Sports Mark
- Provide Rescue Test swimming training for all staff
- To promote more regular quick-fire physical activity 'brain breaks' for teachers to use in class
- To ensure sports equipment is fit for purpose and enables the curriculum to be delivered effectively

- Use Swim England swimming and water safety passports to track and assess pupils' swimming ability in every year group to ensure we have a clear record of children's swimming progress and who can or can't swim 25m (2 lengths of our pool would be 30m). This will also allow us to stretch children who are secure in the national curriculum objectives.
- To maintain the new system of 'Sports Leaders'. Keep training for the children up-to-date.
- To ensure the children continue to have access to 2 hours of high-quality physical activity teaching during curriculum time (reinforce and suggest alternative sessions to teachers if wet weather)
- To continue to reinforce the use of the Get Set 4 PE scheme of work and resources and provide all staff with up-to-date training
- To achieve Platinum Sports Mark
- Provide Rescue Test swimming training for all staff
- To promote the use of daily mile at least 3 times a week to ensure children have active breaks.
