

MESSAGE FROM MR REID

Happy New Year!

I hope you have all had a **good Christmas break** and got to spend time **together as a family**. The children have returned to school with **enthusiasm** and it has been great to see so **many smiley faces coming through the gate** in the morning. I'm sure the two inset days provided a little more time to rest before the start of term. My own children went back to school on Tuesday 2nd January which seemed very early!

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nset Days

Our two inset days were productive. Tuesday was spent **reviewing** and **updating** the **PSHE** (Personal, Social and Health Education) curriculum, which is based on our six school values.

On Wednesday an external trainer, Kelly Hannaghan, delivered an **excellent morning session** to all teachers and TAs on **how to support children who display symptoms of mental health issues**. It was good to explore how to support children with everyday normal worries but also recognise when it becomes more than that. **The focus was on empowering children (and adults) to self-regulate** with simple techniques and strategies if they begin to feel overwhelmed. We also completed an audit identifying areas that we are **doing well** in and others that would benefit from **further development**.

Hopefully this work will support enabling **all children to thrive** in and out of school. Life is full of ups and downs but if we can give every child a simple toolkit of strategies it can make a big difference.

Determination

This term's value is **Determination** which is often **much needed** at the **beginning of the new term in January.**

I shared in assembly a range of stories about determination and how powerful it can be if you set a goal. We also discussed that real determination is still trying your hardest even when things are difficult. We agreed that it was easy to try hard at the things we like or are already good at. If we are to grow and develop as people, feeling uncomfortable at times will be necessary.

It is unrealistic, and not normal, to expect to feel good and happy all the time. We have to embrace the full range of the human experience and give ourselves permission to fully exist in every mood and season.

The Children's Commissioner launches new campaign to hear from children ahead of the General Election



The Children's Commissioner launches 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children and young people about what they want from Government.

Ahead of the next General Election, the Children's Commissioner for England is launching a new campaign to ensure that children and young people are at the heart of the political debate.

Dame Rachel de Souza wants The Big Ambition, which is being launched today, to be the most ambitious and comprehensive survey ever to capture children and young people's voices.

The results will be used to encourage policymakers to think about children and young people's needs, to ensure their voices are reflected in the decisions that will affect them in years to come.

As Children's Commissioner, it is Dame Rachel's duty to promote and protect the rights of all children, especially those children living away from home or receiving support from children's social care services.

She will be listening to children across the country, to hear about their lives so she can champion their priorities for the next election and will be trying very hard to reach as many children living in care or with care experience as possible.

Notes to Editors:

The Big Ambition campaign follows on from The Big Ask (which reached 500,000 young people) but is an opportunity for children, who cannot vote, to have their say in the run-up to the next General Election. Dame Rachel de Souza will use the answers to make sure children's voices are heard by politicians from all parties.

The survey is available here. All children aged 6-18 and parents of children aged 0-18 can take part.
