Whole School Book Project

I am pleased to be able to announce the title of our next whole school book project which we begin after half term. We are going to be studying Moth by Isabel Thomas and Daniel Egneus. Isabel Thomas is a science writer and children's author. She has written more than 180 books about science and nature for children. Moth is a story of change and survival.

Resting upon speckled, freckled trees, the peppered moth lies hidden and safe from hungry predators. Until the world begins to change ... Smoke fills the air and branches are blackened with soot. Watch out! Now, the little moth is easy to spot. But what happens next? Can moth survive in this new landscape?

It is a wonderful book that I'm sure will inspire a wide range of exciting writing and

artwork. The story has a scientific angle that will introduce the children to natural selection and evolution. Our book projects have always been a huge success and I'm sure Moth will be no different.

The project will begin after half term and we are very excited that we have managed to book Isabel Thomas to visit the school, all day, on Tuesday 27th February as part of the project. She will conduct workshops throughout the day with each year group.

It is a beautiful and informative book, which I would encourage you to buy before the project starts so your child is familiar with the text. I'm sure it will spark their imaginations and pose many inquisitive questions.



Determination

In assembly this week we have continued our focus on *determination* by learning about Rosa Parks.

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We explored the story of her life, showing how her refusal to give up her seat to a white person on a segregated bus changed the rules of American society, and led towards equality and **justice for everyone**, whatever the colour of their skin. This small act changed American society forever.
