Forest School

Road Safety and Parking

Parking on double yellow lines away from the school also creates safety issues for children crossing the road. Unfortunately we continue to receive complaints from local residents that driveways are being blocked by parked cars.

I know it can be very hard to find a space but if no legal or safe space is available it will involve you having to park further away and walking.





COMMUNITY EVENTS

Dear Resident / Parents

I have been working with my district council colleagues Cllrs Nigel Williams, Kim Bayley and Graham Clack as well as local Parish Councils in relation to road safety in the areas close to Amherst School and Chevening CE School. The schools and parents are very much in favour of a 20mph zone in neighbouring roads, and speaking to a number of residents, many also agree.



Therefore, we have arranged for a consultation to take place, over a potential 20mph speed limit on the following roads:

- Barnfield Road. Bullfinch Lane, Chesterfield Drive, Elmstead Close, Stanhope Way & Witches Lane - for their entire length
- Chevening Road extend the existing limit from the property boundary of 52/54 Chevening Road for a distance of 416 metres in a north westerly direction to the existing 40mph limit
- Chipstead Lane from its junction with Witches Lane to its junction with The Square.

The consultation is now live – with a deadline for comments of noon on Monday 4 March. Here is a link to the consultation:
