This list is not definitive but it gives you a broad outline of the areas being addressed this term. In order to aid your child's research, our topics are:


- English:
  - Varjak Paw by S.F. Said:

The original book and its excellent sequel (which we will not read in class) are widely available on Amazon and in bookshops (£6).

• *The Tempest* by William Shakespeare:

A brilliant resource which we would recommend to every family is *The Shakespeare Stories* (£13), a set of 16 adaptations of Shakespeare's plays for children, written by Andrew Matthews and Tony Ross.

 Dragon Poetry and Information Texts: There are many poetry books to recommend to children to get them used to poetic language and style, including:





The Works: Every Poem You Will Ever Need At School Michael Rosen's A-Z: The best children's poetry A Poem for Every Night of the Year

- Maths: Decimals, Money, Time, Shape, Statistics, Geometry
- Science: Sound and States of Matter
- History: Tudors
- Computing: Photo Editing (using the *paint.net* app) and Branching Databases
- RE: Hinduism (What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?) and Life as a Journey
- Art: Tudor Portraits
- **DT:** Cooking (Healthy Muffins)

#### Homework

Each week, homework will be given out by **Friday**, to be returned at the latest by the following **Wednesday** (apart from Planners, due on Fridays). There are four strands to the Year 4 homework:

## 1.Lexia

You will hopefully already be familiar with Lexia from last year. It is an online resource which supports general Literacy skills in an engaging and personalised way for each pupil. To use Lexia, your child will need access to a laptop, desktop computer or tablet for at least 20-30 minutes each week:



- a) Go to www.lexiacore5.com OR install the Lexia Core5 Reading iPad app.
- b) Enter the teacher email: **school@amherst.kent.sch.uk** (only needed the first time you log in).
- c) Enter your Username and Password, which we will stick into your child's yellow Planner (the basic rule is: first name followed by two letters of surname, e.g. JohnSm for John Smith, with a password of 'school').

If there is any problem with accessing this homework on a computer each week, please do let your child's class teacher know so they can provide an alternative activity. Children who have completed the Lexia scheme will complete a comprehension-based activity each week.






## 2. MA Books

Your child should spend around 20-30 minutes completing a page of their Mental Arithmetic (MA) book each week. It is important that MA corrections are completed before starting a new test: every mistake is an opportunity to learn! In an ideal scenario, your child would be able to complete most of the page independently and some parents will choose to go through questions with the child afterwards, helping them with any tricky ones. Please feel free to include a comment or a \* next to questions

which your child has struggled with as we will try our best to help the children with these one-to-one in class.

# 3.Reading

Your child should be encouraged to read for at least twenty minutes daily whether independently or with an adult. The children should record the book title and the pages read in their school 'Planner'. These books will be checked by an adult each week and if possible should be in school daily.



# 4.Spelling

Your child will bring home an orange spelling homework book in which to spend about 20 minutes practising the 10 spelling words for the Weekly Spelling Test the following Friday. We will expect to see evidence of spelling practice (we will show examples of this at the Meet the Teacher event). These 10 words will be drawn from two sources:

- The spelling rule taught in class that week in our spelling lesson.
- The National Curriculum's Year 3/4 'statutory word list'.

### **School Equipment**

Please can you check with your child that they have all of the necessary equipment in school, including a 30cm ruler, scissors, spare glue and black dry wipe pens. It would be useful for them to have a spare glue stick at school as these often run out. This term we will continue to give out 'handwriting licences' to those children who can demonstrate our school's cursive script accurately and consistently across all work. These children may bring in a fountain or handwriting pen to write in blue ink. All children will be able to write using a pen after half term in preparation for Year 5.
