Topics

This list is not definitive but it gives you a broad outline of the areas being addressed this term. In order to aid your child's research, our topics for the Summer term are:

- Literacy:
 - Holes
 - Historical Texts based on the Ancient Greeks
 - The Boy at the Back of the Class
- Maths: Shape, Angles, Statistics, Geometry, Algebra, Ratio and proportion, general revision
- Science: 'Animals including Humans' and 'Sound'
- **History:** Ancient Greece
- **Computing:** Coding and Creating Media (video editing)
- RE: Islam What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today? And Places of Worship
- Art: Clay designs inspired by Ancient Greece
- **PE:** Yoga and Swimming
- Games: Cricket and Rounders

Maths & English homework: Our English work is typically based around work completed, or due to be completed in school, to embed understanding and should be completed in full sentences wherever possible. Please encourage your child to complete all MA corrections before starting a new test (Year 5 continue to be set 2 tests a week, unless told otherwise) and to always write using our school's cursive script: abcdefahijklmnaparstwwxxyz.

Reading: Your child should be encouraged to read for a minimum of twenty minutes daily, whether independently or with an adult. The children should record the book title and the pages read in their school 'Planners', which will be checked each Friday. Reading is one of the most effective ways to improve children's educational outcomes and we would encourage you to cultivate a consistent, positive attitude to reading at home – as much and as often as possible.

Unfinished or additional pieces of work may be set at the discretion of the class teacher to be completed at home.

Classroom Equipment

Please can you check with your child that they have all of the necessary equipment in school, including a 30cm ruler, scissors, glue stick, compass, protractor and black dry wipe pens. It would be useful for them to have a spare glue stick at school as these often run out.
