Maths: Children should complete **one page** of MA each week which should take between 20 – 30 minutes to complete. It remains imperative for children to complete corrections from previous weeks before continuing onto the next test. If they then get their corrections wrong, they should ask for help in school. MA homework should be completed in **pencil**.

Children should also continue to practise their **times tables** and corresponding division facts at home (up to 12 x 12). All children have a login for Times Tables Rock Stars using our school subscription.

English: Children will receive an English task which should take approximately 30 minutes to complete. This task will often provide opportunities to practise grammar or punctuation skills taught in class whilst applying their weekly spellings. When deemed appropriate and beneficial, slightly longer or more open tasks may be set. English homework should be completed in **handwriting or ink pen** but if this is not possible then a pencil should be used.

Spelling: Children will receive a list of 10 spellings (plus challenge words) each week and should spend at least 20 minutes practising them in preparation for the weekly spelling test on the following **Wednesday**. The spellings will be drawn from: Spelling rules learnt in lessons, Y5/6 statutory word list from the National Curriculum and topic-based words.

Reading: It is vital that the children are encouraged to read as extensively as possible. We recommend that your child reads for at least 30 minutes each night. The children must record their daily reading in their school planner and should bring their planners in **daily**. Please sign your child's planner each week before it is checked at school on a **Friday** to indicate that you have heard them read. Recommended reading lists are available on the school website.

Additional Information

We are organising a **WWII day** in school on Wednesday 12th November. We would like the children to come to school dressed as an evacuee child. Costumes do not have to be very complicated (or expensive) but we would like every child to dress up in line with this World War II theme. Further information to follow.

As part of our WWII topic, we will also be visiting an Anderson Shelter in our local area. A specific date will be confirmed soon but, in the meantime, please provide consent for local visits on School Gateway.

After half term, the children will design and create their own WWII model shelters in school. Amherst will purchase most of the materials needed to build them however we will encourage the children to collate their own resources as well if they wish – please do not spend lots of money on this! The best materials are spare pieces of cardboard, coloured decorations and anything surplus around the house.

P.E. & Games

In Term 1, Year 6 **Games** lessons will be on **Fridays** and **Indoor PE** lessons will be on **Tuesdays**. Please note that this will change during the year and that the classes will rotate sports in Games over Terms 1-3.

Initial class sports/equipment:

6DT – Hockey (trainers, shin pads, long socks, gum shield and normal PE kit)

6N – Football (football boots/trainers, shin pads and normal PE kit)

6A – Tag Rugby (football boots/trainers and normal PE kit)

Indoor PE – Dance (normal PE kit)

Normal PE kit: trainers, a navy t-shirt, navy shorts/skort, navy tracksuit bottoms and sweatshirt or Team Amherst hoodie. We intend to teach PE regardless of the weather wherever possible so please ensure your child has appropriate clothing as the weather gets colder. Earrings will need to be removed or taped over for P.E.

We hope that the information provided will enable you to work alongside us in providing the best possible support and encouragement for your child. The Year 6 staff are very much looking forward to a busy and productive year with your children.
