MESSAGE FROM MR REID

Pantomime This Year

This year the Stag Theatre reduced their number of performances and are not offering a morning performance that we have traditionally attended. We are still keen for the children to **experience a Christmas show** so this year we have booked a theatre company to come into school on **Monday 1st December** to perform **'Beauty and the Beast'**. Feedback from other schools is incredibly positive about the quality of the show and I am sure it will be a **wonderful experience** and a **great way to start the festive season** at Amherst!

Book Recommendation

I rediscovered an **excellent book this week** which I hadn't read for a while. It is ***Silence In The Age of Noise*** by **Erling Kagge**. It is short and very easy to read. Below is a short extract to give you a feel for the author's tone and content:

Everyone gets bored now and then. Obviously. Boredom can be described as a lack of purpose. When I was young, waiting for something to happen, I got bored to the point where it was almost painful. My mother told me it was healthy to be bored. Only now do I understand what she meant. Today I observe my children when they think nothing is happening: bored to tears, imprisoned in themselves, almost desperate. Like my mother, I feel it would be best if they could experience that more often.

The problem is that we carry on seeking 'increasingly more powerful experiences' instead of pausing to breathe deeply, shut out the world and use the time to experience ourselves. The idea that boredom can be avoided by constantly pursuing something new, being available around the clock, sending messages and clicking further, watching something you haven't seen, is naive. The more you try to avoid boredom, the more bored you become.

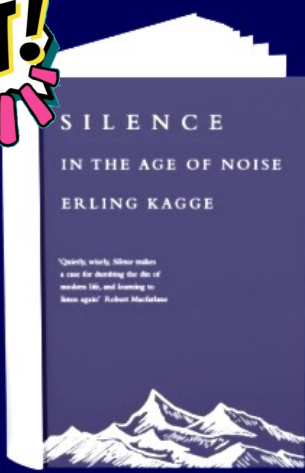
A pursuit that may seem like a waste of time on one given day, such as playing a game or watching a documentary, can provide a lovely, pleasure-filled pause on the next. Regardless, it is worthwhile reflecting on what brings purpose and joy. We should set a small goal to remember that next time.

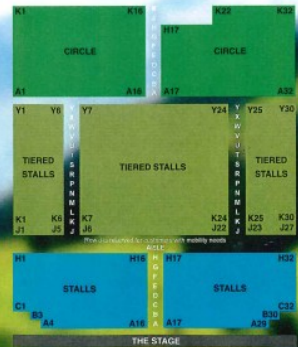

E-scooters – are you breaking the law?



Can I ride my e-scooter to school or work?

No, it's illegal...

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It's not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them.

Can I ride my e-scooter on the pavement?

No, it's illegal...

You cannot use e-scooters on public footpaths, cycle lanes or roads.

What happens if I'm caught using my e-scooter in public spaces?

The scooter may be seized and as a result, destroyed.

If stopped by an officer, you may be asked to complete a breath and drugs test. You also risk a £300 fine and six penalty points on your licence for no insurance.

Think before you buy:
